Staff Summary

Staff is returning with a final version of the online Humboldt County Bicycle & Trails Map App. The web-based application is highly interactive and accessible via mobile phone. The map shows bike routes and classifications, icons for bike shops, bike rental/bike sharing stations, and tool stations. The data for bike parking locations was not complete enough to show bike parking on the map.

The final map can be found through the project landing page (still under development pending final marketing materials and full launch) at: <http://hcaog.net/documents/humboldt-bay-area-bike-map>. Unfortunately, Google Maps is not able to integrate our map and data into their site at this time.

The last phase of the project will be advertising and marketing the application, so people are aware of it. Staff is working with the consultant to create a graphic poster as well as a 3.5" x 2" business card that will be placed on visitor center kiosks, bicycle shops, and other popular destinations. Availability of the app will be shared via social media channels and distributed to bicycle and active transportation advocates to share with their communities.
